## **FEFCO**

## **Corrugated constructions**

FEFCO is a standardized system used internationally to identify and classify different types of corrugated packaging. FEFCO codes consist of a four- or five-digit numerical code. The first two digits represent the main category of the packaging, while the subsequent digits specify a subcategory.

The most common main categories of FEFCO codes:

01: Rolled products (sheets and single-faced corrugated board)

02: Slotted boxes. Boxes that are essentially made from one piece. Joining is done by stapling, gluing, or taping.

03: Telescope boxes

04: Folded cartons and trays (die-cut packaging) Generally made in one piece and usually require no joining. 05: Bottoms and lids (slide boxes)

06: Carrying boxes (three-piece packaging)

07: Fixings, trays, and inserts (pre-glued packaging) Often made in one piece and ready for use with a few simple steps.

08: Ready-glued cases (Trade and e-commerce packaging)

09: Interior packaging

## **Boxes with rills**

With rills, the box can be easily adjusted to fit the contents. The box is cut down to the desired height and folded to match the product's shape.

One box fits multiple products, which is cost-effective and saves storage space since one box can replace several.
